Video (optional)

Submit a **1-5 minute** video as another way to represent yourself and your ideas. It's fine to use the camera on your smartphone. Videos don't need to be highly stylized or edited to be successful. Even single shot videos can be a strong representation of you and your work. If you want to be creative, go for it!

Tips for creating a video:

- Videos can show anything such as you working in the studio, you at your college, documentation of your artwork, a digital or animated video of your own creation, animation, etc.
- Record videos in **LANDSCAPE mode** <u>not portrait mode</u>, which shows as a narrow vertical window on larger screens.
- **LIGHT** can greatly impact your video. In general, indirect natural lighting is more flattering and easier to manage than artificial lighting.
- **SOUND** could be anything from you speaking, music, or even silence. If you are going to speak, make sure your voice is easy to hear and there is no distracting background noise.
- To reduce shakiness, use a tripod or put the camera or phone on a stable surface.
- If videos are not your strength, you can ask for help from someone as long as you are not
 misrepresenting your own creative abilities. For example, you can ask someone to shoot a video
 of you speaking about your work, help you edit the video, and add background music.
 However, asking someone to create an animated video for you could be a misrepresentation of
 your skills.

- **Production** Outsourced production such as casting, screen printing, welding etc.

- **Equipment** (computer, camera, etc.)
- **Shipping** of artwork for the packing and freight of artwork.
- Studio Rent/Fees
- **Housing** a portion of your housing costs while you are a full-time or part-time student or if you are traveling.
- **Transportation** the most economical round-trip transportation, either air or ground, for artists traveling from another community. Mileage reimbursement is allowable at the standard IRS rate of \$0.66/mile.\$0.67/mile
- **Per Diem** for travel or out of town opportunities to cover meals, local transportation, and other incidentals not provided by the host. U.S. Government recommends a range of \$59-79 daily depending on the location. Calculate rates here.
- Visa/Passport Fees
- **Liability Insurance** for projects that involve art installations, exhibitions, and/or shipment of artwork. Artists are encouraged to secure liability insurance in the artist's own name, if the host institution does not already have policies in place, to protect their artwork and themselves. This broker insures independent artists.
- Marketing/Publicity costs including printing, web hosting, postage, etc.
- **Professional Fees** for contracted services such as graphic designers, marketing, business plan development, legal fees as it related to business ventures, etc.
- **Registration Fees** for attending conferences, participation in art fairs and trade shows, LLC fees, etc.
- **Artist Salary** for your time in a grant-funded project (not allowable for scholarships). A suggested way to value your time and calculate your personal income for this project budget is to use this formula: *Divide your current annual income by 1,500 to get an hourly rate (1,500 is based on the estimated amount of time an artist works annually). Example: If you earn \$35,000/year, then divide that by 1,500 and your HOURLY RATE is \$23.
- * Multiply your hourly rate by 8 to get a DAILY RATE. Example: \$23 X 8 = \$184
- * Multiply your daily rate by 5 to get a WEEKLY RATE. Example: $$184 \times 5 = 920
- * Note: personal income earned through this grant may be subject to income tax.

Non-Allowable Expenses include - but are not limited to - student loan payments, debts, and medical expenses. The Foundation recognizes how such factors impact lives, and we are exploring how to support artists in times of hardship.
