

2022-2023 Scholarship GUIDELINES

The Ana & Adeline Foundation Scholarship Program funds opportunities for YAYA alumni representing a range of ages, stages in their careers, and disciplines in the visual arts and design.

Scholarships \$750 to \$10,000

About the Foundation

The Ana & Adeline Foundation, created by YAYA founder Jana Napoli, supports the emerging YAYA artist community through resources for advancing their individual careers and personal ambitions as artists and leaders in visual arts and design through their adult lives. The Ana & Adeline Foundation is in essence the sequel to YAYA, founded in 1988 to provide educational experiences in the arts and entrepreneurship to New Orleans-area children and youth.

Who is eligible to apply?

- YAYA alumni of any age and career status are encouraged to apply. The Foundation is interested in supporting diverse YAYA alumni- from recent high school graduates to established professional artists, as well as those who seek to nurture their creative pursuits while juggling the many demands of life.
- YAYA alumni, as defined by the Foundation, are visual artists and designers who:
 - 1) Participated in YAYA for a minimum of two consecutive years and
 - 2) Earned a high school diploma or GED by May 31, 2022
- Applicants must [ENROLL](#) with the Foundation by completing a short form found on the Foundation website homepage. This one-time form determines eligibility for all future opportunities with the Foundation. If you don't remember whether or not you have enrolled, you can confirm via Submittable.
- Past applicants may re-apply as long as they are in good standing with the Foundation and have submitted past final reports.

How to Apply

Applications must be completed on-line **by midnight Monday April 18, 2022.**

Applications Include:

- Online application form and essay
- Budget
- Resumé
- 5 work samples (JPEG) and a one-minute to four-minute video pitch
- Attachments as required by the specific type of scholarship application: i.e. school acceptance letter, transcripts, letters of support, reference letter (for first-time applicants), etc.

SCHOLARSHIPS \$750 - \$10,000 to attend an accredited college, university, or professional institute to pursue a degree or take courses related to the field of visual arts, design, or other studies that contribute to a career in the arts.

Criteria

- Scholarships may be used for tuition, housing, transportation, school related materials/supplies, internet service, school fees, and senior art shows costs.
- If the applicant is studying courses that are not specific to the field of arts, for example grant writing or accounting, then the application must clearly state in the essay how such courses relate to the applicant's goals for their career or leadership in the arts.
- School enrollment must take place during the time-frame: June 2022- May 2023.
- Scholarship recipients may apply for up to 5 consecutive years as long as they are continuously enrolled either as part-time or full-time student or until they earn a degree, whichever comes first.
- **Renewing scholars** must complete an application form but are not required submit a final report. (Scholarship final reports are only required for graduating seniors or those who do not plan to renew the scholarship.)
- Renewing scholars must submit their 2021-2022 transcript or equivalent before funds are released for 2022-2023.

Mini-Scholarship \$750 for artists of any age and stage in life for continued education

- Allowable costs include tuition, materials/supplies, studio or workshop fees, internet service, and transportation to attend a community college, art school or other arts education institution.
- Mini-Scholarships can be a steppingstone towards applying for larger scholarships in the future.

Online Form

- Online applications are **DUE by MIDNIGHT (CST) Monday, April 18, 2022.**
- You can start, save and make changes in the same on-line application form until the deadline at midnight April 18.

Application Worksheet

- Use the APPLICATION WORKSHEET to draft your proposal and organize your attachments before you start the online form.
- Download the APPLICATION WORKSHEET from [APPLY](#) section of the Foundation website or contact the Foundation to request a hardcopy.
- Please see the APPLICATION WORKSHEET for complete details about required attachments specified for grants and scholarships.

Please note:

- Applicants may submit only *one* application for each funding cycle.
- Past award recipients are eligible to reapply as long as they are in good standing with the Foundation and current with all final reports

Application Support

- Applicants are required to participate in the Zoom *Info Session* and are strongly advised to schedule a *One-on-One Review*.
- *Info Sessions* provide an overview of the Scholarship Program, Guidelines, and application form. Examples of applications are presented as models.
- *One-on-One Reviews* offer applicants a private zoom meeting to discuss their applications and to review a draft version of their application.
- Applicants are encouraged to contact Foundation for feedback and guidance in preparing applications.
- Computer and WiFi access can be provided to New Orleans based artists for completing the application. Public libraries also provide computer access and WiFi.

Funding Decisions

First-time scholarship applications are reviewed by a volunteer jury of independent professional advisors who make recommendations to the Board of Directors for final funding decisions. The total amount of awards is determined each year by the annual budget.

Renewing Scholars

2021-2022 SCHOLARSHIP recipients renewing scholarships must submit their most recent transcript before 2022-2023 funds can be released. Spring 2022 transcripts or grades must be submitted when received from your school.

Final Report

Graduating scholars must submit a final report within 30 days of completion of their educational experience or graduation. The final report link will be posted on the Foundation website.

Taxes

The IRS may consider grants and scholarships taxable income. Please factor grants and scholarships into your overall annual tax planning or consult with an accountant.
